Liturgical Resources

Domestic Violence Awareness can be emphasized, at the following points in the celebration of the liturgy:

- Introductory comments at the beginning of Mass
- General Intercessions (See Sample Intercessions)
- Homily
- Selection of Music (See Music Suggestions)
- Announcements after Communion

In Homilies

Include a reference to domestic violence when appropriate. Just a mention of domestic violence lets abused women know that someone cares. Describe what abuse is so that women begin to recognize and name what is happening to them.

Blessings from the Book of Blessing:

- Blessing of a Victim of Crime or Oppression
- Organizations Concerned with Public Need
