RELIGION

LEVEL 8

STANDARD 1: CREED - Students will demonstrate understanding of core Catholic beliefs.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Summarize the meaning of the Apostles Creed and Nicene Creed.
- 2. Summarize the development of Christian throughout history, from the apostolic age until the present. Include study of the Vatican Councils.
- 3. Continue to reflect on the mystery of the Holy Trinity in relationship to the dignity of the human being, the eternal soul, origin of sin and death
- 4. Continue to reflect on the life of Jesus his titles, the Paschal Mystery.
- 5. Continue to reflect on the role of the Holy Spirit as they identify images of the church, age of the Spirit and Pentecost.
- 6. Continue to reflect on Mary as a model of faith, Virgin Mother, model of faith and the different devotions for Mary.

STANDARD 2: WORSHIP AND SACRAMENTS - Students will demonstrate understanding and practice of Catholic worship and sacraments with an emphasis on the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of Catholics.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand and participate in Eucharistic ministries of lector and usher.
- 2. Plan and participate in Eucharistic celebration.
- 3. Understands symbols and signs used in worship; sacred images; icons; singing and music; local customs; Roman rite, and religious holidays from other cultures.
- 4. Understand and explain the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. Understand and explain the sacraments of healing: Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. Understand and explain the sacraments of service: Matrimony and Holy Orders.

STANDARD 3: MORALITY - Students will understand right from wrong and be able to make good moral choices in life decisions that are consistent with Church teachings and a Christian life style.

- 1. Explain the difference between the "Letter of the Law" and the "Spirit of the Law".
- 2. Explain situations that require higher moral judgment.
- 3. Explain a moral decision-making process.
- 4. Explain the importance of Catholic values in the decision-making process.
- 5. Explain the view of the Church in local and national decision-making processes in the areas such as abortion, death penalty, euthanasia, etc.

- 6. Explain the difference between venial sin and mortal sin.
- 7. Understand the cardinal and theological virtues and the importance of demonstrating that in their personal life.
- 8. Understand the importance of purity, chastity, modesty and marriage.
- 9. Understand how media and other technology influences moral decision making.

STANDARD 4: SOCIAL JUSTICE - Students will demonstrate understanding of Catholic social teaching and apply these principles to social and personal situations.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Demonstrate respect and care for all creation and value all of life.
- 2. Appreciate the diverse roles of members in a community.
- 3. Actively participate as members of a community.
- 4. Demonstrate the Corporal Works and Spiritual Works of Mercy.
- 5. Appreciates the dignity of work and the rights of workers.
- 6. Understand all people stand in solidarity with each other.
- 7. Demonstrate care for God's creation.

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STANDARD 5: CORE SCRIPTURE - Students will read, interpret and apply Scripture to their own daily life situation.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand and explain the main events in the Old Testament.
- 2. Understand and explain the main events in New Testament, including the post resurrection and early life of the Church.
- 3. Understand the Scriptures as a basis for living a Christian life. Knows and
- 4. Understands the parts and books of the Bible. Writes and can find references to the books of the Bible.
- 5. Memorize short Scripture passages related to the curriculum.

STANDARD 6: FAMILY LIFE - Students will demonstrate their understanding of Christian family life and how it is nourished and passed on.

- 1. Understand that Jesus' plan for lasting happiness is summed up in the Beatitudes. Rules and guidelines give direction and purpose to one's life.
- 2. Demonstrate that all should use their gifts and talents in a manner that befits themselves and benefits themselves and others.
- 3. Understand that God's gift of life should be valued and respected. The Church rejects threats to life such as abortion, euthanasia, murder and the death penalty.

- 4. Understand and demonstrate that responsible dating behavior can be applied to all relationships. Dating is preparation for marriage and family life.
- 5. Understand that modesty is a virtue that helps adolescents with sexuality and that the sinful, selfish misuse of sexuality affects society.
- 6. Understand that the sacrament and vocation of Marriage involves faith, fidelity and procreation.
- 7. Understand and demonstrate that each person contributes to God's Kingdom of justice, love and peace. In God's plan, every life has a meaning and purpose.

STANDARD 7: LITURGICAL YEAR - Students will demonstrate their understanding of the Liturgical year and how it is celebrated.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand and celebrate the liturgical year in meaningful ways.
- 2. Understand seasons of Advent and Christmas and how they are celebrated.
- 3. Understand seasons of Lent, Holy Week and Easter and how they are celebrated.
- 4. Understand Pentecost and season of ordinary time.
- 5. Plan and participate in simple prayer services for the liturgical seasons, especially as they relate to salvation history in Old and New Testament.

STANDARD 8: CHRISTIAN PRAYER AND PRACTICE - Students will be able to demonstrate, understand, use and identify traditional prayer forms in the Catholic tradition.

- 1. Understand and use a variety of prayer sources:
 - a. Scripture
 - b. Liturgy
 - c. Music
 - d Psalms
 - e. Canticles.
- 2. Understand and experience the various kinds of prayers:
 - a. Liturgical (sacraments and Liturgy of the Hours)
 - b. Devotional (rosary, benediction, stations of the cross, novenas, etc.)
 - c. Meditation and contemplation
 - d. Praying with Scripture
 - e. Journalizing
- 3, Recognize forms of spirituality
 - a. Monastic
 - b. Dominican
 - c. Franciscan

STANDARD 9: VOCABULARY - Students will be able to demonstrate understanding and use of religious vocabulary.

STANDARD 10: VOCATION – LIFE STYLES - Students will demonstrate their understanding of different vocations and life styles to prepare them to respond to their own call.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand our individual gifts and share them with others.
- 2. Identify the needs of the community and reach out to others
- 3. Identify needs of the world and ways we can help others.
- 4. Understands that people may serve God by using their gifts properly and acting according to their life's calling
- 5. Identify and describe those who have service jobs in our community: health care providers, police, fire department, teachers, priests and ministers, etc.
- 6. Understand the special ministry of clergy and religious and the different ways to serve in the Church.
- 7. Understand that each of us is called by God to a special vocation in life.
- 8. Know, understand and participate in the ministries available in their parish and school.

STANDARD 11: SERVICE - Students will engage in service to the community (family, parish, local, national, and global) by action and reflection on our response to the Gospel call.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand how they can make a difference through service to others.
- 2. Actively participate in service projects.
- 3. Actively participate in the parish (where applicable). Actively witness their faith.
- 4. Explain the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.

STANDARD 12: SAINTS - Students will explore the lives of the saints in order to expand their role models for Christian living.

- 1. Celebrate and understands the feasts of Mary: annunciation, visitation and assumption.
- 2. Celebrate and understands the feasts of Our Lord: Corpus Christi and Christ the King

3. Celebrate and understand the life and feast of canonized saints:

4. Celebrate and understand the life of modern day saints:

STANDARD 13: CHURCH HISTORY – Students will explore the development and history of the Church.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Integrate in Social Studies the spread of the Roman Catholic Church.
- 2. Understand the universality of the Church, the meaning of "catholic."
- 3. Understand the development of the Church from the Reformation to the modern age.
- 4. Understand how other Christian religions came from the Roman Catholic Church.

STANDARD 14: STEWARDSHIP – Students will demonstrate an understanding of Catholic stewardship and apply the knowledge by sharing their time, talent and treasure.

- 1. Justice is something we do in all actions we respect the rights of others and work toward the common good
- 2. Justice toward God is giving God his due, loving Him with all our heart, soul and mind
- 3. Nurture a relationship with God through prayer especially Eucharist and knowing Scripture
- 4. Gratefulness comes from the realization that everything we have is gift from God
- 5. Demonstrate understanding that forgiveness is a gift we have received from God. As stewards of God's gifts, we ought to forgive others
- 6. See evangelization as part of good stewardship and social justice making known the great love of God to those who do not know Him
